

Being a By-law of the Municipality of Morris, relative to the acquisition of certain lands.

WHEREAS the Rural Municipality of Morris has been offered the lands and premises hereinafter described, presently being used as recreational property in the Village of Lowe Farm, in Manitoba so that continuity of title and continued use of said lands and premises for the ratepayers of the Municipality resident in the Lowe Farm area may be achieved;

AND WHEREAS the Rural Municipality of Morris is prepared to accept transfer of said lands and premises to itself to achieve the desired objectives;

THEREFORE NOW be it and it is hereby enacted as a By-law of the Rural Municipality of Morris in council duly assembled as follows:

1. THAT the Rural Municipality of Morris accept a transfer of the following described lands, namely:

"The Most Westerly One Hundred and Sixty-three feet in perpendicular width of Lot Fourteen, as shown on a plan of Special Survey of part of the South West Quarter of Section Six in Township Five and Range One (and of the Village of Lowe Farm), West of the Principal Meridian, in the Province of Manitoba, registered in the Morden Land Titles Office as No. 693."

from Edward Groening, of the Village of Lowe Farm, in Manitoba, Retired Farmer, at and for the nominal price and sum of One (\$1.00) Dollar and other good and valuable consideration.

2. THAT the said lands and premises be acquired by the Municipality and maintained for recreational purposes or other purposes beneficial to the ratepayers of the Municipality resident in the Lowe Farm area in Manitoba.
