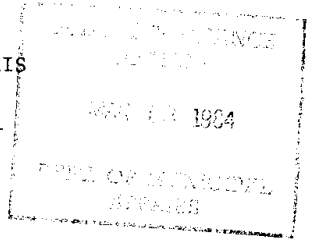


RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF MORRIS

BY-LAW NO. 1281/84

BEING a by-law to amend By-law No. 1165



WHEREAS By-law No. 1165 authorized the expenditure of a sum of money to construct a water distribution system and a low pressure sewage collection and disposal system in Lowe Farm, Manitoba;

AND WHEREAS the above by-law authorized the borrowing of monies by the issue and sale of debentures for the above project;

AND WHEREAS Schedule "B" of By-law No. 1165 described the local improvement area which is to provide for the payment of the debenture issue for this project;

AND WHEREAS certain properties had the wrong frontage and amount stated in Schedule "B" of By-law No. 1165 and which should be corrected;

AND WHEREAS the Council of the Rural Municipality of Morris is of the opinion that the frontage of these certain properties stated in Schedule "B" of By-law No. 1165 should now be amended;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Council of the Rural Municipality of Morris duly assembled enacts as follows:

- 1. That the following listed properties being part of Schedule "B" of By-law No. 1165, be hereby now amended to show the correct rates stated below:

Roll No.	Description	Frontage	Annual Cost \$1.50/ft.
30400	Lots 1/13 and Lots 22/24. in Block 2, Plan 522	280.0 ft.	\$420.00
30450	Lots 14/21, in Block 2, Plan 522	200.0 ft.	\$300.00

- 2. That this by-law shall come into force and take effect upon receiving approval of the Municipal Board of Manitoba and upon being duly completed by the Rural Municipality of Morris.
