

BY-LAW No. 663

By-law No. 663 of the Rural Municipality of Morris being a by-law to provide for the Nomination and Election of three Councillors for the said Rural Municipality of Morris for the years 1943 and 1944. In pursuance of the provisions of the Manitoba Municipal Act 1902 and amendments thereto, the Council of the Rural Municipality of Morris enacts as follows:

In accordance with sections 113 and 304 of Chapter 57 and subsequent amendments of the said Act, a meeting of the said Electors of the Municipality shall be held for receiving Nominations of Candidates for the office of Councillors for Wards 1, 2 and 4 of the said Municipality for the ensuing years A.D. 1943 and 1944 on Tuesday November 10th, between the hours of one and two o'clock in the afternoon at the Court House Morris.

2. That W. N. Stevenson shall act as Returning Officer.

3. That if more Candidates than one be nominated for the office of Councillors for the Municipality, or for the several wards thereof than are required to be elected under the Act, the Returning Officer or Chairman shall announce the same and shall make known to the Electors present the time and place or places, when and where the Poll or Polls shall be open for the taking of votes for the Candidates nominated, which under Section 113 of Chapter 57, 1933 shall be on Friday the 20th day of November, commencing at the hour of nine o'clock in the forenoon and closing at the hour of five o'clock in the afternoon of the same day.

4. That in case a Poll is demanded for Councillors, the following shall be the divisions and appointed Polling places:

(a) Ward 1, Poll No. 1. All duly qualified Electors of the said Ward with Polling Booth at Broadview Achool House.

(b) Ward 2, Poll No. 2. All duly qualified Electors of the said Ward living East of the C.P.R. line with Polling Booth at Robert Taylors house NE¹/₄ 24-5-1E.

Poll No. 3. All duly qualified Electors of the said Ward living West of the C.P.R. line at Rosenhoff School House, Sec. 21-5-1E.

(c) Ward 4, Poll No. 1. All duly qualified Electors of the said Ward living South of the division line between Townships Five and Six with Polling Booth at Armour School House.

Poll No. 2. All duly qualified Electors of the said Ward living North of the Dividing line between Townships Five and Six with Polling Booth at Provencher School House.

Provided that in Wards 2 and 4 any Elector in either of those Wards who has not voted before during the day may vote at the Polling Booth in the Ward that he is nearest to on the day of Election. But no Elector shall vote in more than one Polling Booth in which he belongs.

The foregoing By-Law was read a first, second and third time and passed on the 16th day of October A.D. 1942.
