

BY-LAW No. 673 of the Rural Municipality of Morris

BY-LAW No. 673 of the Rural Municipality of Morris being a by-law to provide for the nomination and election of a Reeve and three Councillors for the said Rural Municipality of Morris for the years 1944 and 1945. In pursuance of the provisions of the Manitoba Municipal Act 1902 and amendments thereto, the Council of the Rural Municipality of Morris enacts as follows:

In accordance with sections 113 and 304 of Chapter 57 amendments 1933 of the said Act, a meeting of the said Electors of the Municipality shall be held for receiving Nominations of Candidates for the Office of Reeve and for Councillors for Wards 3, 5 and 6, of the said Municipality for the ensuing years A.D. 1944 and 1945 on Tuesday November 9th, between the hours of One and Two o'clock in the afternoon at the Court House, Morris.

1. That W. N. Stevenson shall act as Returning Officer.

2. That if more Candidates than one be nominated for the Office of Reeve, or for Councillors for the Municipality, or for the several Wards thereof than are required to be elected under the Act, the Returning Officer or Chairman shall announce same and shall make known to the Electors present, the time and place or places, when and where the poll or polls shall be open for the taking of votes for the Candidates nominated, which under section 113 of Chapter 57, 1933, shall be on Friday the 19th of November, commencing at the hour of Nine o'clock in the forenoon and closing at the hour of Five o'clock in the afternoon of the same day.

3. That in case of a poll is demanded for Reeve the following shall be the divisions and appointed polling places:

(a) Ward 1 Poll No. 1 - All duly qualified Electors of the said Ward with Polling Booth at Broadview School House.

(b) Ward 2 Poll No. 1 - All duly qualified Electors of the said Ward living east of the C.P.R. line with Polling Booth at the Robert Taylor House, N.E. 24-5-1E. Poll No. 2 - All duly qualified Electors of the said Ward living west of the C.P.R. line, at Rosenhoff School House, Sec. 20-5-1E.

(c) Ward 3 Poll No. 1 - All duly qualified Electors of the said Ward living east of the C.P.R. line with Polling Booth at Bouret School House. Poll No. 2 - All duly qualified Electors of the said Ward living west of the C.P.R. line with Polling Booth at Lea Bank School House.

Ward 4 Poll No. 1 - All duly qualified Electors of the said Ward living south of the Division line between Township Five and Six with Polling Booth at Armour School House. Ward 4 Poll No. 2 - All duly qualified Electors of the said Ward living north of the Division line between Township Five and Six with Polling Booth at Provencher School House.

(d) Ward 5 Poll No. 1 - All duly qualified Electors of the said Ward living in the north half of the Ward with Polling Booth at Lowe Farm School House. Poll No. 2 - All duly qualified Electors of the said Ward living in the south half of the Ward with Polling Booth at Rosefarm School House.

(e) Ward 6 Poll No. 1 - All duly qualified Electors of the said Ward with Polling Booth at Orange Hall, Sperling.


4. That in case a Poll is demanded for Councillors only then the Poll will be held in the Ward or Wards demanding such Poll.

Provided that in Wards 3, 5 and 6 an Elector in either of those Wards who has not voted before during the day may vote at the Polling Booth in the Ward that he is nearest to on the day of Election.

But no Elector shall vote in more than one Polling Booth in which he belongs.

The foregoing By-Law was read a First, Second and Third time and passed on the 15th day of October A.D. 1943.
