

BY-LAW No. 705 OF THE  
RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF MORRIS

WHEREAS the Trustees of the Rosenort School District No. 60 have passed a by-law authorizing the borrowing of Eight thousand (\$8,000.00) Dollars by issue of debentures.

AND WHEREAS the said by-law has been approved by the Municipal and Public Utility Board.

AND WHEREAS it is necessary to submit the by-law to the electors of the said School District.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Council of the Rural Municipality of Morris enacts as follows:

1. The said by-law No. 3 of the School District of Rosenort No. 60, as approved by the Municipal and Public Utility Board, shall be submitted to a vote of the electors of the said School District on the 19th day of July, 1946, and for the purpose of taking the vote thereon, All of the proceedings provided by the Municipal Act and applicable to taking the said vote shall be taken. The polls shall be open at the hour of nine o'clock in the forenoon and remain open until the hour of five o'clock in the afternoon and the said vote shall be taken at the Rosenort school house and the Secretary of the School District shall be the deputy returning officer to take the votes of the said electors.
2. There shall be published in three successive issues of The Morris Herald and in one issue of The Manitoba Gazette, at least two weeks before voting, a notice signed by the Clerk setting forth concisely the object of the by-law and naming the hour, day and place fixed for taking the votes of the electors for and against the said by-law. There shall also be posted in four of the most public places within the said School District a copy of said notice.

3. On the 18th day of July, A. D. 1946, at the hour of three o'clock in the afternoon the Reeve of the Municipality shall attend at the Municipal Office of the town of Morris, for the purpose of appointing persons to attend at the voting and the official summing up of the votes hereinafter referred to, on behalf of the persons interested in the submission of the said by-law and promoting or opposing the passing of the same.

4. Before any person is so appointed, as in the next preceding paragraph hereof provided, he shall make and subscribe before the Head of the Council, a declaration in the following form:

Agent's Declaration in By-law voting:

I, the undersigned, A. B., solemnly declare that I am a ratepayer of the Rural Municipality of Morris, and that I am desirous of promoting (or opposing, as the case is) the passing of the by-law authorizing the purchasing of a site, building and equipping a two room school and moving teacher's residence to new site in Rosenort School District No. 60, submitted by the Council of the Rural Municipality of Morris.

5. During the time appointed for polling, no person shall be entitled or permitted to be present in any polling place other than the Deputy Returning Officer and persons authorized to attend, and an elector while in attendance for the purpose of voting.

6. The Clerk of the Municipality shall prepare a correct list of all the persons legally qualified to vote on said by-law.

7. On the 19th day of July, A. D. 1946, at the

hour of seven o'clock in the afternoon the Clerk of the Municipality shall sum up the number of votes given for and against the said by-law. If the majority of the electors are found to have voted in favour of the said by-law the Clerk shall notify the Secretary-treasurer of the School District and the Municipal and Public Utility Board accordingly.

DONE AND PASSED at a regular Meeting of the Council held on the 21st day of June, A. D. 1946.
