

RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF MORRIS

BY-LAW No. 715.

By-Law No. 715 of the Rural Municipality of Morris, being a By-Law for the cancellation of certain Taxes.

Whereas, Section 1196 of "The Municipal Act", 1940, provides as follows:

- 1. A Municipality by By-Law may cancel in whole or in part any Taxes or any debt or moneys owing to the Municipality.
- 2. No By-Law passed under this section shall have any force or effect until the Minister certifies that evidence has been filed with him establishing the bona-fides of the By-Law, and that it is in the best interests of the Municipality.

And Whereas, the Council of the Rural Municipality of Morris considers that it is in the best interests of the Municipality to cancel the hereinafter mentioned Taxes amounting to \$ 606.92 and owing to the said Municipality.

Now Therefore, The Reeve and Council of the Rural Municipality of Morris, in Session, enacts as follows:

- (A) That the General School Levy on all the Taxable Property in that portion of the Morris School District in the Rural Municipality of Morris, in the amount of \$ 506.92, levied in error in the Year 1946, be cancelled.
- (B) That the Taxes in the amount of \$46.60, levied on annexes of the Canadian Consolidated Grain Co. at Kane, Manitoba be cancelled, as the annexes did not exist in the year 1946.
- (C) That Taxes amounting to \$22.15 levied on part Area "D" in error in previous years, said Taxes having been levied Twice on same property in the One year be now cancelled.
- (D) That the Taxes in the amount of \$31.15, levied on annexes of the Canadian Consolidated Grain Co. at Sperling, Man., be cancelled, as the annexes did not exist the whole of the year 1946.

Done and passed in open Council this 20th day of December A.D. 1946.
