

BY-LAW NO.722 of the Rural Municipality of Morris.

The Council of the Rural Municipality of Morris has been advised by the Department of Municipal Affairs to alter Part 1 of Schedule "A" of By-Law No.719, showing \$21,840.42 Drainage Debenture at a Mill Rate of 5.5 and \$92,480.32 1946 overexpenditure to be partially met by a Mill Rate of 16.5 in place of the amounts and rates as shown on said "Schedule "A", of By-Law # 719. respectively.

WHEREAS it is deemed expedient to rescind By-Law # 719 and make the suggested changes AND WHEREAS "The Municipal Act" requires every Municipal Corporation on or before the last day of February in each year, to make estimates of all sums required for the lawful purposes of the Corporation for the year in which such sums are required to be levied and to pay all it's debts falling due within the year, making due allowances for taxes imposed on lands purchased by the Corporation at Tax-Sale and considered uncollectable and for the cost of collection and abatement and losses which may occur in the collection of taxes, which allowance is hereinafter referred to as tax reserve;

AND WHEREAS the Rural Municipality of Morris has made estimates of all sums required for the lawful purposes of the Corporation for the year 1947, excepting for that of Schools, as the Department of Education and the Premier of the Province have advised of a definite change in Provincial Financial assistance to Education for the year 1947;

AND WHEREAS it is necessary by BY-LAW or BY-LAWS to levy a rate or rates of so much on the Dollar upon the assessed value of all the rateable property liable therefore in the Municipality as the council deems sufficient to raise the sums required for the Lawful Purposes of the Corporation as shown by the Estimates;

AND WHEREAS the assessed value of the whole rateable property within the Rural Municipality of Morris according to the last revised assessment roll is \$ 4,255,030.00;

AND WHEREAS it is necessary to fix the rates of taxation for the purposes aforesaid and the time for payment of all rates and Taxes so fixed and levied;

NOW THEREFORE the Council of the Rural Municipality of Morris in Council assembled enacts as follows:

(1) That By-Law No.719 be hereby rescinded and is replaced by this By-Law # 722 as the Rate By-Law for the year 1947.

(2) That the estimates of the Council of the Rural Municipality of Morris of all Sums required for the lawful purposes of the Corporation for the year 1947 as set out in Schedule "A" hereof and identified by the signatures of the head of the Council, Chairman of the Finance Committee and Clerk are hereby approved.

Uncontrollable Purposes.

(3) That the following respective Mill Rates be and are hereby levied for the year 1947 upon the assessed value of all rateable Property in the Municipality respectively liable therefor according to the last revised General and Personal Property Assessment rolls thereof, to raise the sums required for the uncontrollable purposes of the Corporation, which said rates, assessed values and sums required are set out in Schedule "A", viz:

(a) A general rate of 8. Mills on the Dollar to provide for the payment to each and every School District in the Municipality as provided under the new Financial assistance.

(b) The following respective rates of so many Mills on the Dollar, viz:
