

BY-LAW NO.727 of the Rural Municipality of Morris.

By-Law No.727 of the Rural Municipality of Morris, being a By-Law to provide for the nomination and election of a Reeve and three Councillors for the said Rural Municipality of Morris for the years 1948 and 1949, and for a Councillor for Ward four for the year 1948.

In pursuance with the provisions of "the Municipal Act", and amendments thereto, the Council of the Rural Municipality of Morris enacts as follows:

1. That a meeting of the Electors and Rate-payers of the Municipality shall be held for receiving nominations of candidates for the offices of Councillors for Wards Three, Four, Five and Six and for Reeve as aforesaid, on Tuesday the 14th day of October 1948 at the Court House Building in the town of Morris, between the hours of One and Two O'Clock in the afternoon.

2. That Jas. Pottinger of Morris, shall be the Returning Officer.

3. That if more candidates than One be nominated for Reeve, or Councillors for Wards Three, Four, Five and Six as aforesaid at such nomination, the Returning Officer shall announce same and shall then make known to the people present, the time and place or places when, and where the poll or polls shall be open for the taking of votes for the Candidates so nominated. Which shall be on Friday, the 24th day of October A.D. 1947. Commencing at 9.00 O'Clock in the forenoon and closing at 5.00 O'Clock in the afternoon of the same day.

4. That the following shall be the divisions and polling places :-

(a) Ward One, poll #1-All duly qualified electors of the said Ward with polling booth at Broadview School House.

(b) Ward Two, poll # 1-All duly qualified electors of the said Ward living East of the C.P.R. line, with polling booth at Mrs. Robert Taylors' house, N.E. 24-5-1E. poll # 2 - All duly qualified electors of the said Ward living West of the C.P.R. line, at Rosenhoff School House - Sec. 20-5-1E.

(c) Ward Three - poll # 1 - All duly qualified Electors of the said Ward living East of the C.P.R. line, with polling booth at ~~Lea Bank School House~~, poll # 2 All duly qualified Electors of the said Ward living West of the C.P.R. line, with polling booth at Lea Bank School House.

(d) Ward Four, poll #1-All duly qualified Electors of the said Ward living South of the division line between Townships Five and Six, with polling booth at Armour School House. Poll # 2- All duly qualified Electors of said Ward living North of the division line between Townships Five and Six, with polling booth at Provencher School House.

(e) Ward Five, Poll # 1 - All duly qualified Electors of the said Ward living in the North half of the Ward, with polling booth at Lowe Farm School House. Poll # 2- All duly qualified Electors of the said Ward living in the South half of said Ward, with polling booth at Rosefarm School House.

(f) Ward Six, poll # 1 - All duly qualified Electors of the said Ward, with the polling booth at the Orange Hall in the Village of Sperling.


5. That in case a Poll is demanded for Councillors, only then the Poll will be held in the Ward or Wards demanding such Poll.


Provided that in Wards Three, Four, Five and Six an Elector in either of those Wards who has not voted before during the day, may vote at the polling booth in the Ward that he or she is nearest to on the day of Election.

No Elector shall vote in more than One polling booth in which he or she belongs.

The Foregoing BY-LAW was read a First, Second and Third times and passed this 19th day of September A.D. 1947
