

BY-LAW No. 854  
of The Rural Municipality of Morris

.....

WHEREAS it is deemed to be in the best interests of the municipality to keep road allowances on municipal and market roads in the municipality free from weeds or grass that may cause the drifting of snow and accumulation thereof on such roads;

NOW THEREFORE, the Council of the Rural Municipality of Morris, in regular session assembled, enacts as follows:

- (1) THAT where weeds or grass are allowed to remain on the grade side or shoulder between the travelled portion of municipal or market roads and the bottom of the ditch, that may cause the drifting of snow and an accumulation thereof on the travelled portion of the road, the owner of the land contiguous to the half of the road on which the weeds and grass are located, upon receiving written notice, shall mow said weeds and grass.
- (2) Failing to mow such weeds and grass within the time specified in the notice, the municipal corporation, by its agent, workman, or servant, at the expense of the owner of the land, may mow the weeds and grass; or may levy the expense of such mowing against the owner of the land in the form of taxes.
