

Rural Municipality of Morris

BY-LAW No. 862

UNDER "THE HEALTH SERVICES ACT" AND "THE MUNICIPAL ACT"

Notice is hereby given that:

- By-law No. 5/59 of the Town of Morris
- By-law No. 59-4 of the Town of Emerson
- By-law No. 861 of the Rural Municipality of Morris

have received their first reading by the respective Councils of the said Municipalities, and will at the time and places hereinafter mentioned be submitted to a vote of the resident ratepayers of the said respective Municipalities entitled to vote thereon, residing within the limits of Morris Hospital District No. 25 as hereinafter described.

The purpose of the above mentioned By-laws is to authorize increased hospital facilities at Morris, Manitoba, and at Emerson, Manitoba.

and to approve and ratify the Supplementary Scheme relating thereto as prepared by the Governing Board and to provide for payment to the Board by each of the said Municipalities of its proportionate share of the costs incidental to such Supplementary Scheme; which said Supplementary Scheme has been duly approved by the Minister of Health and Public Welfare, and is substantially in the words and terms following, namely:

That for the purpose of meeting the Board's annual liability on account of repayment of capital expenditure and interest thereon, and the estimated expenditure for the maintenance and operation of the Morris District Hospital and the Emerson M. N. Unit (less the revenue, if any, therefrom), there be levied annually as a special Rate a Hospital Tax, from all the lands and property within the said District, taxes so collected to be paid to the Board to be applied, firstly: In payment of the principal and interest charges on capital expenditure outstanding from time to time; and, secondly, in payment to the Special Account under the authority of the Board, and thirdly, towards payment of the maintenance and operation of the Morris District Hospital and the Emerson M.N. Unit, other than payments and interest on capital expenditures, as hereinbefore provided.

The said proposed By-laws are also to authorize the Board to borrow from time to time such sums as the Board deems necessary to meet the expenditure of the District until such time as the taxes for the then current year are received; the amounts so borrowed to be a charge upon the taxes due to the District; to authorize the said Board to issue debentures to secure the principal borrowed and interest thereon (said debentures to form a lien and charge against all property owned by the Board and all taxes levied in the district for the payment thereof); and are also to authorize the respective Municipalities, for the purpose of meeting their liabilities to the Board for their apportioned share of the annual contributions for the purpose of repayment of the sum of \$120,000.00 for Morris, and Emerson - \$56,000.00 and for the payment of interest thereon and the maintenance and operation of the Hospital at Morris and the Medical Nursing Unit at Emerson.

to levy and collect annually for a period of 20 years as a special rate a Hospital Tax from all the land and property in each Municipality within the said Morris Hospital District.

The vote of the ratepayers entitled to vote on the scheme and on the respective By-laws ratifying and confirming same shall be taken for and against the said proposed By-laws on Thursday the 25 day of June A.D. 1959, between the hours of nine o'clock in the forenoon and five o'clock in the afternoon, on the said day.

On the 23rd day of June, A.D. 1959, the Reeves and Mayors of the respective Municipalities will attend at their respective Municipal Offices between the hours of 10 o'clock in the forenoon and 11 o'clock afternoon for purpose, if requested, of appointing persons to attend at the polling places and at the final summing up of the votes on behalf of the persons interested in promoting or opposing the respective By-laws.

The clerks of the respective Municipalities will attend at their respective Municipal Offices at the hour of 10 o'clock in the forenoon on Friday the 26th day of June A.D. 1959 to sum up the number of votes for and against the said By-laws.

The original By-laws and copies of the Scheme are filed in the respective Municipal offices and may be examined by interested parties at all reasonable hours before the vote thereon is taken.
