

BY-LAW No. 914
of the Rural Municipality of Morris

WHEREAS pursuant to Section 885 (b) of The Municipal Act being Cap. 173, R. S. M. 1954 and Amendments thereto,

Any municipal Corporation may pass by-laws not inconsistent with the Public Health Act and the regulations thereunder for preventing persons from throwing any dirt, paper, filth, carcasses of animals or rubbish on any Highway or on any private property so as to cause a nuisance.

AND WHEREAS pursuant to Section 968 of The Municipal Act being Cap. 173 R.S.M. 1954 and amendments thereto Every Municipal corporation may pass by-laws

(a) for inflicting fines and penalties, not exceeding fifty dollars, in addition to costs, for breach of any of the by-laws of the corporation;

(b) for inflicting punishment by imprisonment for breach of any of its by-laws, in case of non-payment of fine and costs inflicted for any such breach, for a period not exceeding thirty days.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Rural Municipality of Morris, in Council duly assembled enacts as follows:

1. THAT it shall be unlawful for any person to throw any dirt, paper, filth, carcasses of animals, or rubbish, on any highway, or on any private property so as to cause a nuisance;
2. THAT any person violating any provision of this section is guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars and in default of payment of such fine shall be liable to imprisonment not exceeding thirty (30) days.
