

BEING A BY-LAW OF THE RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF MORRIS

ENACTED PURSUANT TO THE CIVIL DEFENCE ACT, CAP. 38, R.S.M. 1954.

WHEREAS Section 8 of The Civil Defence Act provides, in part, as follows:

"8. (1) The council of a municipality may, by by-law, establish a committee and adopt a plan to deal with all matters of civil disaster or war emergency, or both, within the municipality.

(7) The powers and authority granted by this section to a municipality shall be exercised by it subject to all other provisions of this Act and the regulations, and to all orders made, and acts and things done, by the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, pursuant to this Act, and subject to the direction and supervision of the Co-ordinator.

(8) The Council of a municipality may appoint a person to co-ordinate and control, under the direction of the committee if one has been established by the council, any municipal civil defence organization, and the person so appointed shall co-operate with the Co-ordinator."

AND WHEREAS Section 15 of the Act provides as follows: -

"15. (1) Subject to subsection (2), the powers conferred by this Act upon a municipality may, by agreement entered into by the respective municipalities, be exercised jointly by two or more municipalities on such basis as is determined by the agreement.

(2) An agreement made under subsection (1) shall have no effect unless it has been approved and authorized in the manner required under subsection (2) of Section 8 in the case of a by-law passed under subsection (1) of that section."

AND WHEREAS by agreement between The Town of Morris; The Rural Municipality of Morris; The Rural Municipality of MacDonald; The Rural Municipality of Ritchot; and The Rural Municipality of Montcalm; bearing date the 26th day of June A.D. 1967, approved and authorized as prescribed by Section 8 (2) of the said Act, a copy of which agreement is attached hereto and marked as Schedule "A" to By-law No. 972, the said municipalities agreed to exercise jointly the powers conferred upon them by The Civil Defence Act on terms implemented hereby;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED AS FOLLOWS:

1. There is hereby established a committee to be described henceforth as The Emergency Measures Committee, consisting of 10 persons, Councillors of the aforesaid municipalities, The Rural Municipality of Morris will hereby appoint as its representatives, 2 councillors; namely C.W. Anderson (Reeve) and G.P. Goossen (Councillor). Pursuant to the terms of the Aforesaid Agreement, the Mayor of the Town of Morris, namely A. R. Godkin is hereby appointed Chairman of the Emergency Measures Committee; and the Reeve of the Rural Municipality of Morris, namely C. W. Anderson is hereby appointed Deputy Chairman.

2. The Plan for dealing with matters of Civil Disaster and war emergency outlined in the memorandum attached hereto and marked as Schedule "A" to this by-law as it may be from time to time amended, is hereby adopted, and the Emergency Measures Control Committee is hereby authorized and directed to establish the sub-committees hereinafter specified, and to prepare and recommend to Council, measures in furtherance of the said Plan.

3. Harold Clow of the Town of Morris is hereby appointed Controller of the Emergency Measures within the area of the aforesaid municipalities, and charged with the responsibilities prescribed in Section 8 (8) of The Civil Defence Act, which responsibilities are to be discharged under the direction of the Emergency Measures Committee and in co-operation with the Manitoba Emergency Measures Co-ordinator.

4. The Emergency Measures Committee shall establish the following sub-committees and such other sub-committees as are necessary to report on and recommend to it measures to be implemented in connection with the Plan regarding: -

(a) Welfare Sub-Committee: - Recruitment and training of local personnel in: -

- Emergency Feeding
- Emergency Clothing
- Emergency Lodging
- Personal Services
- Registration and Inquiry


and overall development of reception plan for the Emergency Area;

- (b) Health Services Sub-Committee: - An extension and co-ordination of existing health services - provincial, municipal and private; recruitment and training of volunteers; Emergency Casualty treatment; prevention of diseases and epidemics; emergency organization of existing hospital facilities; planning emergency hospital accommodation;
- (c) Fire Protection Sub-Committee: - To develop in conjunction with the Provincial Fire Commissioner a fire defence plan for the area, including co-ordination of existing fire departments; recruitment and training of volunteer fire fighters; availability of water; equipment; command control;
- (d) Engineering Sub-Committee: - Co-ordination and extension of existing engineering and utility services of the community. Main responsibilities are repair of utility services; road clearance; emergency building repairs; decontamination of streets and buildings; demolition of unsafe structures;
- (e) Rescue Service: - Recruitment and training of personnel for the rescue of people who have become trapped under debris or collapsed structures. Provision and maintenance of equipment for rescue; training of rescue teams in first aid;
- (f) Warden Service: - Guides and advisors to general public; pre-education of residents; assistance to police in evacuation and maintaining law and order; aids in billeting evacuees; and
- (g) Police Service: - Maintenance of law and order; traffic control.

5. By-law nos. 916 and 917 of the Rural Municipality of Morris are hereby repealed.




