

BY-LAW NO. 750

BEING A BY-LAW OF THE RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF MORRIS FOR OPENING A HIGHWAY, PURSUANT TO SECTION 474 OF THE MUNICIPAL ACT.

WHEREAS Section 474 of The Municipal Act provides, in part, as follows:

- (1) Every municipal corporation may pass by-laws
  - (a) for opening, establishing, making, preserving, maintaining, improving, constructing, repairing, widening, enlarging, altering, diverting, or closing highways within its jurisdiction, and for entering upon, breaking up, taking, or using, any Land in any way necessary or convenient for the purposes, subject to the restrictions in this Act, and for preventing and removing any obstruction upon any such highways;

AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient that a highway be opened over, upon and across the lands hereinafter described;

AND WHEREAS the owners of all the land required to be taken for the purposes of establishing and opening the said highway have consented in writing to the passage of this By-law and to the acquisition of the said land by the Municipality.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT AND IT IS HEREBY PASSED AND ENACTED AS A BY-LAW OF THE RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF MORRIS, IN COUNCIL DULY ASSEMBLED, AS FOLLOWS:


1. That the following described lands, namely:

Being all that portion of Lot Twelve, which lot is shewn on a plan of survey of part of the South-west Quarter of Section Six, in the Fifth Township and First Range West of the Principal Meridian, in Manitoba, registered in the Morden Land Titles Office as No. 431, and all that portion of Lot Six, which lot is shewn on a plan of part of said Quarter Section registered in the said office as No. 693, taken for Sixth Street and shewn outlined in pink on a plan prepared by Joseph Henry Wilson, Manitoba Land Surveyor, and sworn to by him on the 17th day of September, 1968, which plan is hereby adopted and approved,

are hereby expropriated, and the officers, employees and agents of the Municipality are authorized and empowered to enter in and upon such lands and to break up the same for highway purposes.

2. That the said lands shown as Sixth Street and outlined in pink on the aforementioned plan of survey are hereby opened up and established as a public roadway and dedicated for such purpose.
3. The Secretary-Treasurer is directed to endorse the aforementioned plan of survey for identification, affixing his signature under the corporate seal of the municipality, together with a reference to this by-law.
